**ARROYO GRANDE CITY COUNCIL  
TAKES ACTION TO OPPOSE MEASURE J**

At the September 26, 2006 meeting, the Arroyo Grande City Council unanimously voted to oppose Measure J, a countywide measure on the November 7<sup>th</sup> ballot regarding the proposed Dalidio project. The action followed presentations by representatives from Caltrans and the San Luis Obispo Council of Governments (SLOCOG) regarding traffic impacts projected from the project. The City Council's decision was based on the insufficient amount of funding required in the measure for transportation improvements to address the costs projected as necessary to mitigate expected traffic congestion. The Council's identified concern was that this could potentially divert State and regional funding from important projects in Arroyo Grande and other areas of the County, resulting in further delays to needed improvements such as the Brisco Road – Halcyon Road/ Highway 101 Interchange. In the action taken, the City Council made clear that the vote was exclusively in response to the issue of unresolved traffic impacts and was not intended to communicate any position on the design or content of the proposed Dalidio project.
